ATTENTION DSO'S AND RO'S

SEVP NEEDS YOUR HELP

Last year we saw a 30% increase in the number of I-515A's issued. The primary reasons for the I-515A were because the student forgot their travel paperwork or they were traveling with unsigned/outdated travel documents.

The issuance of an I-515A causes the student to experience delays at the port of entry and to wait 30-90 days for DHS to update their paperwork. All of this is preventable!!

Here are a few "Best Management Practices" that your colleagues have identified as helpful:

- 1. Travel tip sheets stapled to initial I-20 or DS-2019;
- 2. Affidavit signed by student or exchange visitor verifying the status of his/her travel documents;
- 3. Mandatory registration/orientation for students prior to travel events;
- 4. Reminder notes or emails sent before travel seasons;
- 5. Development of travel booklet by DSO.

Through our combined effort we hope to significantly reduce the number of I-515A's issued. We welcome you to share your Best Management Practices with us.
