## ICE Case Review Process

U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) Enforcement and Removal Operations (ERO) created the ICE Case Review (ICR) process to receive and review inquiries from certain individuals or their representatives.

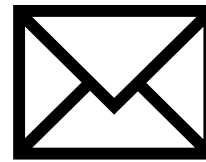

### Local Field Office Contacted

If a noncitizen or their representative believes they do not meet ICE's priorities for enforcement, detention or removal, they are encouraged to first contact their local ERO field office to request a case review.

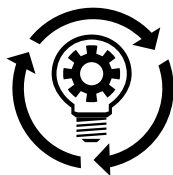
### Inquiry Submitted

After receiving a response from a local review request, the individual may submit an additional review request to ICE's Senior Reviewing Official (SRO).

Submit an inquiry to the SRO at [ICEcasereview@ice.dhs.gov](mailto:ICEcasereview@ice.dhs.gov) - with the following information and supporting documentation:

- A-number and identifying information
- Telephone number
- Valid email Form G-28 or ICE Form I-60-001  
- Required to provide information to the individual's representative.

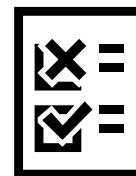

### Submission Reviewed

The SRO reviews the inquiry and coordinates with the local field office and ICE attorneys as appropriate.

### Determination Made and Communicated

Based on the unique factors of the case, a determination is made as to whether the case continues to meet ICE's priorities for enforcement, detention and removal. The determination is communicated back to the requestor via email.
