Comments: This inspection was conducted to determine overall compliance with the ICE Performance-Based National Detention Standards 2011 (42 standards), which include the following additions/changes to the standards listed on page three:

- Medical Care (Women), a new standard, was Not Applicable;
- Classification System is now titled Custody Classification System;
- Suicide Prevention and Intervention is now titled Significant Self-Harm and Suicide Prevention and Intervention;
- Escorted Trips for Non-Medical Emergencies is now titled Trips for Non-Medical Emergencies;
- News Media Interviews and Tours is now titled Interviews and Tours, and;
- Transfer of Detainees is now titled Detainee Transfer

There were no deaths, escapes or serious suicide attempts during the inspection period.

There were fourteen SAAPI allegations during the inspection period. One allegation was found to be substantiated as follows: In November 2017, a detainee, further identified as detainee "A", claimed to have been improperly touched by another detainee, further identified as detainee "B". Detainee B was transferred to segregation. The investigation found that detainee B improperly touched detainee A over his clothing. A review of records confirmed that the cases were appropriately managed in accordance with standard guidelines.

The facility does not have a canine unit. Tasers are not used at this facility. Chemical agents are carried by authorized users and will be used on ICE detainees if needed.

There were twenty-four immediate and three calculated use of force incidents during this inspection period. The incidents were reviewed and all force was determined to be justified and applied only to the degree necessary to control each situation. The calculated use of force incidents included:

12/13/2017 - A detainee in segregation refused to come out of his cell to be transferred. Several staff members attempted intervention to get the detainee to cooperate and he continued to refuse. The detainee was given every chance to comply with staff orders and only when no other options existed, staff used force to gain compliance. The staff used the team technique to restrain the detainee. Medical staff was on scene immediately and there were no staff or detainee injuries.

3/29/2018 – A detainee in a general population cell was observed by staff exhibiting suspicious behavior and was possibly suicidal. Staff attempted to restrain the detainee to move him to medical for observation. Detainee refused multiple orders. Several staff members attempted to get the detainee to agree including medical and mental health staff. Detainee continued to refuse all staff orders. Staff used force to restrain the detainee and moved him to medical. Medical personnel examined all involved immediately after the incident and there were no injuries.

7/3/2018 - A detainee in a medical isolation cell refused staff order to change into a suicide smock. After attempts from several staff were unsuccessful in getting the detainee to comply, a cell extraction team was deployed to gain compliance. OC spray was used prior to the extraction team entrance into the cell. The team technique was used to restrain the detainee. The detainee was decontaminated immediately. Staff and detainee were examined by medical and there were no injuries.

The remaining incidents were all immediate uses of force which included non-routine application of restraints or physical restraint of detainees by staff to break up fights. There were eight uses of OC to restrain non-compliant detainees. Staff and detainees were seen by medical staff immediately after the situations were under control. When OC was used, detainees were immediately decontaminated. There were no staff or detainee injuries. An after-action review of each incident was conducted by senior staff, medical staff and ICE officers. The force used was found to be reasonable, necessary and not excessive.

Section F. as reported on the SIS, is a combined number with the adjacent facility. The numbers in the Assault sections of the SIS worksheet reflect combined numbers from the East and West facilities. The first two sections of the incident summary on page two of this form include statistics from both this facility and the neighboring ICE Dedicated IGSA. The facility could not provide the breakdown of these incidents by facility.
