Comments: The Sexual Abuse and Assault Prevention and Intervention Standard was inspected during this inspection but is not referenced in the Standards Review Summary Report. The standard was rated as Meets Standard for this inspection.

There were no serious suicide attempts or detainee deaths since the previous inspection. There was one allegation of sexual abuse/sexual harassment by an ICE detainee since the previous inspection. This allegation was investigated and determined to be unfounded.

There were no escapes or serious attempts since the previous inspection. There were four spontaneous uses of force involving ICE detainees since the previous inspection. One incident involved a detainee failing to comply to be restrained, which escalated into the detainee being brought into compliance with the use of a Taser and placed in the restraint chair. Another incident involved a detainee physically resisting to be restrained, and a Taser was used to gain compliance. There was an incident where two detainees were sprayed with Oleoresin Capsicum (OC) spray for failure to comply to stop fighting. The fourth incident was a detainee attempting to assault an officer, and OC spray was administered to gain control of the detainee. All use of force reports were reviewed and indicated that force was applied within guidelines of the standard. The medical evaluations were timely, and no detainees were injured. Tasers and Oleoresin Capsicum (OC)/pepper spray are available for use by trained staff to control detainees, if necessary. Canines are not used to control ICE detainees but may be used out of the presence of detainees for contraband detection. The use of choke holds is prohibited.
