Comments: This inspection was conducted to determine the overall compliance with the ICE Performance-Based National Detention Standards (PBNDS) 2011. The following are the PBNDS 2011 additions/changes to the standards listed on page three:

- Medical Care (Women), a new standard, was Not Applicable;
- Classification System is now titled Custody Classification System;
- Suicide Prevention and Intervention is now titled Significant Self-Harm and Suicide Prevention and Intervention;
- Escorted Trips for Non-Medical Emergencies is now titled Trips for Non-Medical Emergencies;
- News Media Interviews and Tours is now titled Interviews and Tours;
- Transfer of Detainees is now titled Detainee Transfers

There were no deaths and no serious suicide attempts during the past year. During the inspection period, there were five allegations of detainee on detainee sexual assault or abuse. Two cases were determined to be unfounded and three were unsubstantiated. Two cases involved staff sending emotional letters to detainees. The cases were considered unsubstantiated. The three staff members involved were fired.

During this inspection period, two county inmates escaped from the facility by cutting through the perimeter fence. The escape was discovered when a count failed to clear. The detainees were recaptured two hours after the escape was discovered. The investigative report included procedural errors relating to perimeter inspections, contraband interdiction, tool control and facility count procedures. As a result of the internal investigation one employee was terminated. Corrective action for procedural deficiencies were observed during this inspection.

The facility does not have a canine unit. Tasers are not used. Chemical agents are carried by certified supervisors. Oleoresin capsicum (OC), the chemical agent used at this facility, will be deployed on ICE detainees, if necessary.

During this inspection period, there were six uses of force involving ICE detainees. Of those instances, four were immediate use of force and two were calculated. The calculated uses of force were cell extractions. The immediate use-of-force situations involved staff responding to detainee fights or detainees refusing to follow staff directions to be escorted to segregation. Medical evaluations were conducted after each incident and there were no serious injuries to staff or detainees. Incidents were properly documented and reviewed. All reports indicated that force was applied within guidelines of the standard.
