Comments: This inspection was conducted to determine overall compliance with the ICE Performance-Based National Detention Standards 2011 (42 standards), which include the following additions/changes to the standards listed on page three:

- Medical Care (Women), a new standard, was rated Meets Standard;
- Classification System is now titled Custody Classification System;
- Suicide Prevention and Intervention is now titled Significant Self-Harm and Suicide Prevention and Intervention;
- Escorted Trips for Non-Medical Emergencies is now titled Trips for Non-Medical Emergencies;
- News Media Interviews and Tours is now titled Interviews and Tours, and;
- Transfer of Detainees is now titled Detainee Transfers

The Significant Summary Worksheet Summary represents data on ICE detainees only, this facility only houses ICE detainees. There were no deaths, serious suicide attempts, or escapes involving detainees during this inspection period. Detainees are not charged a medical co-pay.

There were four reported sexual assault allegations by a detainee reported during this inspection period. None of the allegations involved penetration or required referral for forensic evidence gathering. Two of the allegations were detainee on detainee and two allegations were staff on detainee. The ICE Office of Professional Responsibility was responsible for the criminal investigation of all four allegations. Two of the allegations occurred in August 2018, one in September 2018 and one in February 2019. To date, none of the investigations have been closed and there has been no determination whether the allegations were substantiated, unsubstantiated or unfounded.

There were numerous hunger strikes involving ICE detainees reported during this inspection period. The facility had numerous hungers strikes since the previous inspection. None of the hunger strikes required detainees to receive forced treatment.

There were twelve calculated uses of force incidents involving ICE detainees during this inspection period. The chief of security reported that since the last annual inspection there have been sixty-one use of force incidents involving detainees. Forty-nine incidents involved immediate uses of force and twelve incidents involved calculated uses of force. A total of thirty-five incident packages were reviewed, including all of the calculated use of force incidents. Of these incidents, fourteen involved detainees refusing to follow/obey staff orders; twelve involved detainees assaulting or acting in an aggressive manner towards staff; five involved detainee on detainee fights where force was used to control the incident; three incidents involved detainees harming themselves and one incident involved a detainee resisting during an escort. In each of these incidents, detainees refused all verbal commands and all attempts to use confrontation avoidance/de-escalation techniques proved unsuccessful. In each of these cases officers used minimal physical force/holds to control the detainee(s) and gain control of the incident and apply restraints. There was a single use of OC/pepper spray during the inspection period. In reviewing the incident reports it was evident that many of the incidents involved detainees with significant mental health issues and that staff handled these incidents with the minimal amount of force necessary and only after all efforts to gain compliance had failed.

The thirty-five use of force incident packets reviewed confirmed that the force used in each incident was reasonable and appropriate for the situation. Medical examination and treatment were prompt in each case. Documentation showed that the after-action review committee was very aggressive in identifying training issues and taking administrative action when appropriate. The after-action review committee contained representatives from ICE and the facility. All incident packages contained documentation that the incidents were reviewed by the use of force review committee within the required time limits.

The facility does not have Tasers or a restraint chair. Four/five-point restraints can be used on detainees but no such action occurred during this inspection period. The facility does not have or use a canine unit. The only chemical agent approved for use is oleoresin capsicum (OC)/pepper spray; it is not carried by staff. Central control maintains the inventory and issues to supervisory staff when needed.
