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DIRECTIVE TITLE: ICE Occupant Emergency Plan (OEP)

1. PURPOSE and SCOPE.

- 1.1 This Directive establishes policy and implementing procedures for the U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) Occupant Emergency Plan (OEP). This policy further establishes the National Incident and Response Unit as the ICE office responsible for ensuring implementation of this Directive for ICE facilities and program offices. The scope of the Federal Protective Service (FPS) is to provide assistance in the development of occupant emergency plans and in particular for coordinating the security and law enforcement aspect for all federal tenants. The provisions of this Directive apply to all ICE employees who occupy Federally-owned or leased properties. This policy is implemented independently of existing OEPs at federally occupied facilities where ICE is not the primary occupant.
- 1.2 The ICE OEP Directive is designed to complement the existing OEPs at federally occupied spaces to ensure that all personnel are moved quickly to safety, damage to property is minimized, and proper authorities are notified in the event of a localized emergency.
