SEVP and SEVIS

The Student and Exchange Visitor Program (SEVP) manages the Student and Exchange Visitor Information System (SEVIS). SEVP is a program under the Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) agency within Department of Homeland Security (DHS).

SEVIS came online in 2003 to track and monitor the status and activities of nonimmigrant students and exchange visitors (EVs) who enter the United States. This web-based system collects real-time information on nonimmigrant students, EVs, approved schools, and program sponsors. This information is available to a variety of stakeholders. SEVIS also retains information on Exchange Visitor Program sponsors and visitors that are approved by the Department of State (DoS). The DoS web site is <http://eca.state.gov/jexchanges/index.cfm>

This quarterly review is based on information retrieved on July 1st, 2013. As SEVIS is a real-time data base, exact numbers within this review were accurate as of the date retrieved. The below list contains the various organizations, including DHS – ICE Counterterrorism and Criminal Exploitation Unit (CTCEU), that request data and information stored in SEVIS. SEVP continues to see the number of requests increase as SEVP's abilities and SEVIS' capabilities expand.

Management Review Summary

The SEVIS “General Summary Quarterly Review” is produced to provide a snap-shot of useful information to SEVP management and a variety of SEVIS stakeholders.

This edition of the review represents a sample of information collected from SEVIS data on July 1st, 2013.

Since the program’s inception, the total volume of data in SEVIS continues to grow. On July 1st, 2013, SEVIS contained records for **1,253,705** active nonimmigrant students, exchange visitors, and their dependents. The total number of records for all F-1, M-1, and J-1 visa holders has increased to approximately **11 million**.



Approved Schools by State


- ▶ 36% of all SEVP approved schools are located within the states of California, New York, Florida, Texas, and Pennsylvania.




Geographic Region and Major

Top Ten Country of Citizenship





Top Ten Majors





Students by State

- ▶ California, New York, Texas, Massachusetts, Florida, Illinois, and Pennsylvania have the highest number of active students.
- ▶ These seven states host 54% of all active students.





Level of Education and Course of Study

- ▶ 72% of active students are enrolled in Bachelor's, Master's or Doctoral programs.
- ▶ An approved school may offer several levels of education from pre-school, elementary, high school, to post secondary education level.
