The ICE Health Service Corps (IHSC) Special Operations Unit (ISOU) ensures continuity of medical care for aliens in ICE custody on land, in the air, and at sea. The unit deploys to areas of greatest need, including remote or austere locations, to uphold public health and safeguard national security and public safety.

Who We Are

ICE Health Service Corps comprises a diverse workforce of approximately 1,750 authorized positions that includes federal civil servants, U.S. Public Health Service Commissioned Corps officers, and contract health professionals.

What We Do

ICE Health Service Corps supports ICE's mission to protect national security and public safety, upholds health care standards across ICE-owned and contracted facilities, and ensures the provision of required medical services for detained aliens.
