

Practical Training Overview

Practical training provides international students with experience in their field of study during or upon completion of a degree program in the United States. Students can have multiple training authorizations or receive an authorization and choose not to participate, which often results in a higher number of training authorizations than actual participants. U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) authorizes some forms of practical training.

Optional Practical Training (OPT) for F-1 Students: Form of training, often paid, which directly relates to a student's program of study and can take place during their program of study (precompletion) or after finishing their program of study (post-completion).

STEM OPT for F-1 Students: 24-month extension of post-completion OPT for qualifying students with science, technology, engineering or mathematics (STEM) degrees.

Curricular Practical Training (CPT) for F-1 Students: Alternative work/study, internship, cooperative education or other type of required practicum that a sponsoring employer offers through agreements with a student's college or university.

Differences between Training Opportunities:

Employer Requirements:	Student can work for any employer, but the training must relate to the student's major course of study.	Employer must be able to provide a minimum of 20 hours of training per week. Employer must be enrolled with USCIS through E-Verify.	Authorization is for one specific employer and for a specific period of time.
