Important Note: Only a federal supervisor, manager or sponsor has authorization to complete and submit requests for end users. Please note the following when submitting requests:

- All requests must come from a government email account (e.g., .gov or .mil).
- A separate request must be submitted for each individual SEVIS access request.
- All forms must be in Adobe PDF format and submitted to the new email address: <u>SEVISAccounts.ManagementMailbox@ice.dhs.gov</u>.
- All SEVIS requests must include the Form G-872S, "SEVIS User Roles and Responsibilities," and the signature page of the DHS ICE Rules of Behavior Form. Please ensure all required signatures are included.
- Ensure that the end user is copied on the submitted request to avoid delays in processing time.

Requests that do not follow the above requirements will be rejected.

All SEVP websites will be updated immediately with the new email address. We apologize for any inconvenience this change may have caused.
