## Broadcast Message: DHS Redesignates and Extends Special Student Relief Employment Benefits to Yemeni Students Experiencing Severe Economic Hardship

## General Information

On Dec. 30, 2022, the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) posted a <u>Federal Register Notice</u> announcing the suspension of certain regulatory requirements for F-1 nonimmigrant students from Yemen who are experiencing severe economic hardship as a result of the humanitarian crisis in Yemen. This notice redesignates Special Student Relief (SSR) to include eligible students who are in a lawful F-1 status as of Jan. 3, 2023, and extends relief until Sept. 3, 2024.

This notice temporarily suspends applicable on-campus and off-campus employment regulations for eligible Yemeni students. DHS will continue to monitor the situation in Yemen and will announce any additional modifications or extensions to these notices in the Federal Register.

The notice applies exclusively to F-1 nonimmigrant students who meet all of the following conditions:

- Are a citizen of Yemen regardless of country of birth (or an individual having no nationality who last habitually resided in Yemen);
- Were lawfully present in the United States in F-1 nonimmigrant status under section on Jan. 3, 2023;
- Are enrolled in a Student and Exchange Visitor Program (SEVP)-certified school;
- Are currently maintaining F-1 nonimmigrant status; and
- Are experiencing severe economic hardship as a direct result of the crisis in Yemen.

The suspension of these requirements will remain in effect until Sept. 3, 2024, for eligible Yemeni students.
