## Broadcast Message: DHS Announces Special Student Relief Employment Benefits to Students from Burma Experiencing Severe Economic Hardship

## **General Information**

On March 22, 2024, the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) posted a <u>Federal Register</u> <u>notice</u> announcing the suspension of certain regulatory requirements for F-1 nonimmigrant students from Burma who are experiencing severe economic hardship as a direct result of the current armed conflict and humanitarian crisis in Burma. This notice provides Special Student Relief (SSR) for eligible students from Burma from May 26, 2024, until Nov. 25, 2025.

This notice temporarily suspends applicable on-campus and off-campus employment regulations for eligible students from Burma. DHS will continue to monitor the situation in Burma and will announce any additional modifications or extensions to this notice in the Federal Register.

This notice applies exclusively to F-1 nonimmigrant students who meet all of the following conditions:

- Are citizens of Burma regardless of country of birth (or individuals having no nationality who last habitually resided in Burma);
- Are lawfully present in the United States in an F-1 nonimmigrant status on March 22, 2024;
- Are enrolled in a Student and Exchange Visitor Program (SEVP)-certified school;
- Are currently maintaining F-1 nonimmigrant status; and
- Are experiencing severe economic hardship as a direct result of the current armed conflict and humanitarian crisis in Burma.

The suspension of these requirements will remain in effect until Nov. 25, 2025, for eligible students from Burma.
