## **General Information**

Starting on May 16, 2016, the Student and Exchange Visitor Program (SEVP) changed the Broadcast Message distribution process to reduce the influx of messages Student and Exchange Visitor Information System (SEVIS) users receive via email on a monthly basis.

SEVP only sends emergency, time sensitive, webinar and Batch-related messages via email. All other messages are posted to the SEVIS message board and to the Broadcast Message archive page for SEVIS users to view at their discretion. Below is a brief description of the latest non-emergency message posted to the SEVIS message board from Sept. 15 to Sept. 30. Please be sure to check the message board to review each message in more detail.
